The gallery space quickly becomes a more casual and relaxed environment when you're greeted at the door by Orson, an Irish wolfhound, and his Chihuahua companion Sparky. The two dogs constitute Work No. 591, in which Martin Creed takes from the everyday and puts it - in this case the dogs - in the context of art. Less interesting is Work No. 601, the first in a series of shit films, showing people doing just that on the floor of a white gallery. However commonplace crapping might be, the more mundane and less performative Creed's work, the more interesting, complex and humorous it becomes, such as Work No. 604, in which six phallic cacti are lined up in order of size.


